Discovering that both pianists shared a love for theatre as well as music, they decided to integrate this in the concerts they give. And so, in 2013, piano duo Beth & Flo was born: a piano duo giving classical recitals embellished with songs and spoken word. They have played as a duo in festivals in The Netherlands and, in 2017, performed concerts in New York and in Sicily. In Sicily, participating in the international music competition IBLA Grand Prize, they were awarded as 'Most Distinguished Musicians'.

Winner of the 2014 Royal Overseas League Ensemble Competition, the Solem Quartet was formed in 2011 at the University of Manchester. They enjoy a busy concert schedule performing at venues both across the UK and internationally. As 2016/17 Park Lane Group Artists they gave recitals at Wigmore Hall, Kings Place, St John's Smith Square and St Martin-in-the-fields as part of the PLG recital series. They were also selected as Tunnell Trust Artists in 2016, leading to a tour of Scotland in 2018, and recently completed the Junior Fellowship in Chamber Music at the RNCM.

It was founded in 2013 in Salzburg by three Dutch performers: violinist Gerard Sponk, cellist Irene Enzlin and pianist Vera Kooper. They tour extensively throughout Europe and the rest of the world performing in venues such as St. (London), John's Smith Square the Concertgebouw (Amsterdam), the National Center of Performing Arts (Beijing), the Gang Dong Art Center (Seoul).

The Chavasse Piano Trio was founded in Oxford in 2016 by then Oxford students Elizabeth Nurse (violin), George Needham (Piano), and Joe Davies (Cello). 'Chavasse' comes from the name of the founder of St Peter's College, where the trio held their first concert. Since then, they have gone on to perform in numerous venues across the South East, and were also invited to perform for the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Oxford. Now studying at various conservatories across the country, the three members enjoy busy lives as concerto soloists, chamber musicians, and recital soloists.


Admission to all concerts: £12 at the door; half price for full-time college/university students; no charge for school age student/pupil accompanied by paying adult. Seating is unreserved.
